



My pickup is in the SW corner of the cemetery, under an Oak tree where I unloaded and set my headstone (left of center in the photo).



This shows my headstone facing east, below my right rear tire in the photo. The Sanchez headstone is to the right of mine; 14' 6" from center to center of the two headstones (theirs has red flowers on it). This allows room for one grave to the right of mine (in case a wife wants next to me in the future). However, there is room for 2 or 3 graves on my left, and there are no graves to the west (where my pickup is).



My headstone is in perfect shape after I moved it from McMahan to Willhite cemetery. This cemetery has no policy regarding concrete boxes etc. and no plot fee as of today. I moved it to make my burial plan fit (my prior investment) because McMahan changed its policy, as granted prerogative by law. Lake Spring cemetery also has no box requirements, but has a \$200 fee (24 miles NE of Licking, MO.).

Willhite is located 4 miles NW of Licking, Mo., on Willhite Dr. Willhite Dr. is off of N Hwy, approximately 1 mile north of 32 Hwy.

I chose this epitaph because I believe I'm faithful to those whom I was married to (my ex-wives). Since I've never had any sex with either sex, except in marriage with my ex-wives, I feel it's a true epitaph; even though no one may choose to believe that. All it needs now is a death date, which I'm paying on (needs \$40 more dollars).

This cemetery has war vets in it. Some are Sergeants (U.S. Army and Air Force) and some are privates (Navy). I noticed an old grave marker with an 1815 birth date on it. It has unmarked graves too.



This documents my Mo. License plate # 5YS 085, so you know I moved my headstone, and that it is facing east.
